#### Why ERM at ECN?

- To build capacity within the ECN to assess electoral risks that may affect the peaceful conduct of elections.
- To assist the ECN in making well informed and conflict-sensitive electoral decisions as well as in taking specific actions to prevent and mitigate electoral risks and violence.



#### When ERM System Initiated at ECN?

- ECN accepted the use of ERMTool signed terms of usage with International IDEA in early 2013.
- Implementation of Electoral Risk Management "System" started in the middle of 2013.



#### When ERM System Initiated at ECN?

- "ERM Project" initiated with I-IDEA assistance (Technical and Financial).
- ERMTool put into operation: Risk maps produced, analyzed and used to diagnose physical and psychological violence and to assess risks, necessary actions suggested to prevent and mitigate the risks.





## Where is ECN in the institutionalization process?

- Electoral Statistics, Geographical Information and Risk Analysis Section already established.
- Continued support of International IDEA (HR, Technical, Financial) for capacity building.
- Stakeholders and information sources being identified.
- Regular data collection, analysis, mapping and reporting system.

- Use of IIDEA Guides (Internal & External Factors)
- Baseline Survey (throughout the country)
- Risk Factors Identification Workshops
  - CA Election 2013 (28 factors identified)
  - CA By-election 2014 (11 factors identified)
  - CA By-election 2015 (5 factors identified)
- Primary Data Collection methods (forms/letters/observations)
- Secondary Data Collection methods (law, election results, minutes, documents in various departments within the commission)
- Suggestions from Commission and other department heads

- ERMTool be used in center (overall picture of country) and at district level (district level planning + as a subsystem of center)
- 'Systematic' data collection apparatus within ECN and among stakeholders





- Human Rights Violations




#### **Some Risk Maps**










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


